PSNBA Annual Advocacy Trip to Washington, D.C.

In late February of this year, a delegation of PSNBA officers, Kitsap County Commissioner Josh Brown, and Senator Cantwell's State Director Chris Endresen, made the trip to Washington, D.C. for the PSNBA Annual Advocacy trip. The delegation spent three days meeting with Navy leadership in Virginia and at the Pentagon. This year we were particularly honored to have meetings with both the Secretary of the Navy, Dr. Winters, and the Chief of Naval Operations, Admiral Roughead. Typically, a group does not meet with both offices. However, upon learning that PSNBA was coming to DC, Admiral Roughead insisted that we meet with him. Of course, PSNBA happily obliged. In addition to meeting with the leaders in charge of the surface fleet, submarines, aircraft, maintenance, and the nuclear program, PSNBA spent a day and a half meeting with our Congressional delegation. These meetings with our elected officials centered on our experiences with Navy leadership and also briefing the officials on our issues. This year we had the pleasure of meeting with Congressmen Dicks, Inslee, Smith, and Larsen. The delegation also met with both Senators Murray and Cantwell.

This year's DC Advocacy trip spanned four and a half days and included more than 10 hours of detailed meetings. Your PSNBA delegation is very pleased with the results of our trip and proud of the opportunity to represent you, our members.

PSNBA President Travels to Yokosuka, Japan

Jim Nall, PSNBA President, recently visited Yokosuka, Japan to see first hand what our members will be experiencing during their commute to work in support of the USS George Washington. Mr. Nall reported that the total commute time from leaving his house in Kitsap County, to arriving at the hotel in Yokosuka, Japan, was almost 20 hours – 2 hour commute to the airport, 2 hours waiting for flight (recommended), 11.5 hour flight to Narita Japan, 1 hour wait for immigration & luggage, 3 hour train trip to Yokosuka and .5 hour taxi ride to hotel. PSNBA is actively pursuing a change to the current Joint Travel Regulations in an effort to help our members who will be traveling to Japan.

Mr. Nall toured the USS George Washington pier and was pleased to report that our members will be working at brand new facilities that are very nice. He also discovered plenty of recreational opportunities both on and off base during his stay.

Mr. Nall felt his trip to Japan granted him significant insight into the challenges facing our traveling workforce. Rest assured that PSNBA will continue working hard for our members on issues involving traveling to Japan.
